The clinic is also involved in important research into the viability of using stem cell treatments to help with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). PTSD affects more than 10% of all American veterans according to The US Department of Veterans Affairs.

For veterans of the Vietnam War, the number is estimated to be about 31%. There's a clear need for ground-breaking research like that being performed at Park Avenue Stem Cell and Dr. Singer is leading the way with his talented team of researchers.
