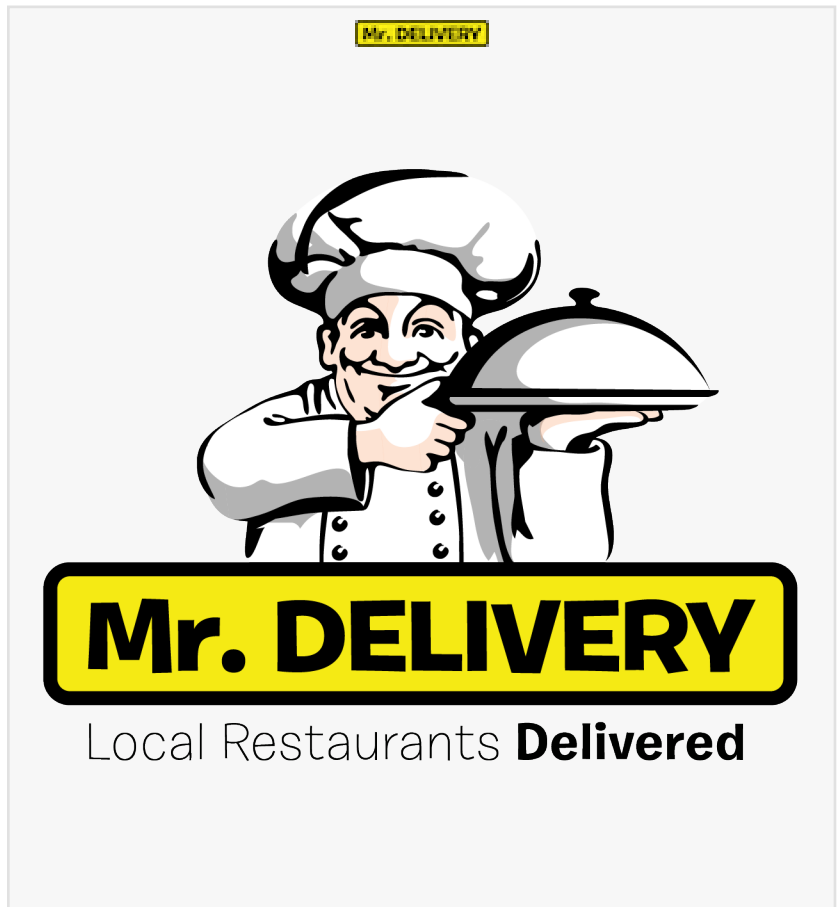

2. West Side Market, Cleveland, OH
