The color of the wood is an important factor as well. “A large space can handle dark wood, which creates a warm impression,” Ander says. “On the other hand, a small office will want to stick with lighter tones to keep the space from feeling cramped.” The shade chosen should coordinate with the image the business is trying to create. It may be modern and trendy or classic and timeless. Hardwood can enhance a homelike feel or tone down an industrial design. Just like with homeowners, the material chosen must coordinate with other aspects of the design to create a cohesive look for the company.
