

Danielle Paige Fleischer Explains The Key Signs Of Car Trouble

Unfortunately, cars are expensive and Danielle Paige Fleischer, who has been a mechanic for most of his life, understands that people are reluctant to take their cars to the garage because they worry that the shops will find a variety of things that are wrong with it.

At the same time, <u>Danielle Paige Fleischer explains</u> that, if something is wrong with a vehicle, there are clues that you can be aware of that indicate the presence of mechanical problems. If you spot any of these clues, then it may be time to request the help of a mechanic. Not just that, but it ensures that you do not end up paying for things you don't need, or that you let the problem get so bad that it will even be more expensive to have it fixed. This is why Danielle Paige Fleischer felt it is important to explain the key warning signs to be aware of that point to some potentially serious car trouble.

Danielle Paige Fleischer on the 5 Car Issues to Look Out For

- 1. An engine that overheats. Not only is this indicative of a problem within your vehicle, it can also be very dangerous. If your vehicle runs low on oil, all the internal parts and components will start rubbing together. This leads to friction. Additionally, if the vehicle is low on coolant, temperatures can also start to rise. Either way, this can lead to the engine rapidly breaking down. In the worst case scenario, it can actually cause a fire, which highlights just how important it is to get professional help as soon as any smoke is visible from the hood or the engine light indicates that it is getting hot.
- 2. Low pressure in the tires. If there is a warning light in your dashboard that tells you the pressure in the tires is low, you must pay attention. When tires have insufficient air in them, the vehicle will be much more difficult to control. Tires grip to the road surface, ensuring you can take corners without spinning. If there isn't enough air in the tires, however, it becomes more difficult to gain traction, particularly if the roads are wet or icy.
- 3. Difficulty in starting the car. A car should, ideally, start on the first try. If you find that it is struggling to do this, then it is easy to assume that the vehicle is simply getting a bit old. While this is certainly part of the problem, it is far more likely that the issue lies with the battery. Indeed, Danielle Paige Fleischer has seen many people who believed their car was completely broken when all they needed was a new battery. A dying battery can be dangerous, as well. It could stop working while you are driving, which can create a serious hazard for other road users and yourself. The car will slowly, but unexpectedly, grind to a halt if the battery malfunctions.
- 4. Problems with the gears. It is possible for gears to start slipping, something that many drivers choose to ignore. They believe, or hope, that they were mistaken. However, if there are changes in the gears, it is likely that there is something wrong with the transmission of the car itself. This could break down completely at any time and this would mean losing control of the car itself.
- 5. The brakes being unresponsive. Danielle Paige Fleischer explains that the brakes must always be

responsive. Even the slightest change means you need to go see a mechanic to have the issue resolved. In order to be able to drive a car safely, it must have fully functioning brakes. Without it, you are placing both yourself and other drivers and road users in danger. If the brakes feel spongy, resistant, or make strange noises, they should also be checked out.

<u>Danielle Paige Fleischer advises</u> that anyone who is experiencing car trouble or notices any of the five pointers above, should seek immediate assistance from a qualified mechanic. In many cases, the necessary repairs are quite minor, such as replacing the brake pads or topping up the oil and coolant. However, the impact of these minor things can be huge. As a vehicle operator, you must be responsible for both yourself and others on the road, and that means looking after your car properly.
