Voie says the industry is expected to attract more women because safety is a priority. New technology is making trucks safer for drivers every day, which will help attract more women and millennials.

"We do a lot of things out there, but there are still women truckers out there who say, "I've never heard of you,' says Voie. "I always say that we'll have achieved our goal when people don't think twice when a woman backs a truck into a loading dock or steps out of an 18-wheeler. There's certainly no reason why women can't make up half the trucking industry. That's a very lofty goal, but there's no reason why we can't attain that."
