Society of St. Vincent de Paul will award the 2018 Sam Carocci Humanitarian Disaster Relief Award to Team Rubicon for its support of St. Vincent de Paul's disaster recovery work after the deadly impact of Hurricane Maria on Puerto Rico. The 2017 Hurricane killed 2975 people and impacted 79 out of the 80 municipalities. FEMA has since registered 869,717 individuals for recovery assistance.

The award ceremony will take place at the opening luncheon of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul's Annual Assembly of its membership at the Manchester Grand Hyatt. The Sam Carocci Humanitarian Award is given each year to an outstanding organization in disaster relief and recovery.

"Team Rubicon assisted us with roof repairs for survivors that were on fixed income, living in poverty, geographically isolated, elderly and households with special and functional needs. Building partnerships is critical to doing disaster recovery and St. Vincent de Paul is honored to be working with our National Voluntary Organization Active in Disaster partner, Team Rubicon in Puerto Rico," said Elizabeth Disco-Shearer, CEO of the Disaster Services Corporation of SVDP-USA.

Team Rubicon boasts an 80,000-strong, highly skilled volunteer force that helps communities stabilize and recover after disasters. Since its inception following the 2010 Haiti earthquake, Team Rubicon has responded to over 280 disasters, including Hurricanes Harvey, Irma and Maria.

"The need for assistance in Puerto Rico is staggering. It's a privilege to partner with St. Vincent de Paul to get even a small number of Puerto Ricans affected back on the road to normalcy in the aftermath of Hurricane Maria," said David Burke, Vice President of Programs and Field Operations at Team Rubicon. "Together, we have repaired or replaced 255 roofs on the island, returning more than 738 Puerto Ricans to safer, more stable homes. We look forward to continuing to work with SVdP in Puerto Rico and beyond."

The House in a Box Program® is a disaster recovery program started by St. Vincent de Paul after Hurricane Katrina and the program provides new household items to families impacted by disaster who have unmet recovery needs. Multi-Agency Resource Centers at the start of recovery, provides specialized long- term recovery training, contracts with State governments and FEMA on disaster case management programs, and works at the state and local government level on Economic Recovery Programs Summits.
