

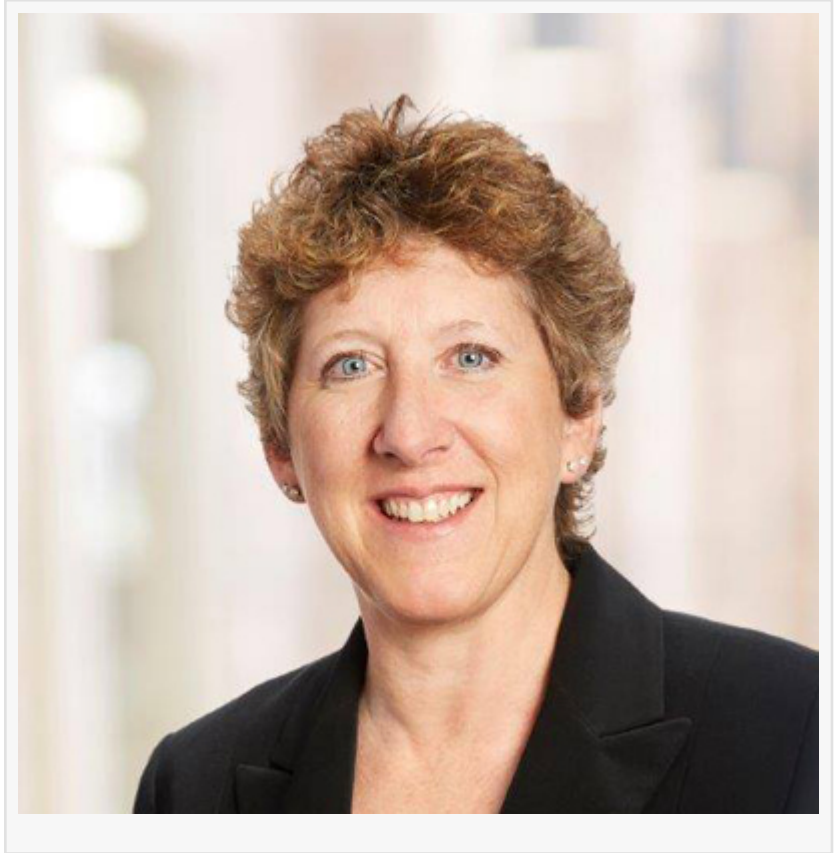
# Carolyn Rubin to be Featured on CUTV News Radio
