


Industry, Academic Experts Lead University Consumer Product Safety Certification Program

The Product Safety Professional Certification Program will be administered by the university's Emerson Leadership Institute (ELI), in cooperation with ADK Information Services, a product safety education and information provider. Individuals who successfully complete the program will be conferred the Consumer Product Safety Professional™ certification designation from the Society of Product Safety Professionals. Following the opening workshop, the program phases into an on-line series of webinars on a variety of product-safety related topics. Candidates must pass an examination consisting of multiple choice questions and an essay, as well as a case study presented to a 3-member panel of product safety professionals and a Saint Louis University professional.
