"In addition to ensuring students receive quality instruction, they often must respond to ancillary needs like access to food and nutrition programs, mental health resources and other support services."

This is the third cohort of superintendents to participate in the program. The first cohort graduated in May 2018. The National Institute for School Leadership (NISL) is partnering with PDE to offer the program. After completing the program, superintendents will receive Act 45 Pennsylvania Inspired Leaders (PIL) Program hours.
