"I have been personally affected by these devastating diseases," said Grimes who is also the brainchild behind Who's Gonna Take Care of Me and Elves for Alzheimer's. "My mother, Gloria Grimes, is one of the more than 5.5 million Americans battling these memory loss diseases." Alzheimer's is ranked as the sixth leading cause of death. According to the World Health Organization, there are estimated 47 million living with dementia worldwide and it is projected to increase to 75 million by 2030. Currently, there is no cure for Alzheimer's or dementia.

These sobering facts led Grimes to create a special newspaper dedicated to inspire, acknowledge, and inform people about a disease that, like it or not, may come to your home or a home near you. "Minority communities and vulnerable populations are in desperate need of assistance and education," said Grimes. "There are two Alzheimer's organizations in Greater Los Angeles who we are in contact about maximizing our efforts and bridging the gap in the minority communities which have been under-served way too long."

African American women have the highest rate of Alzheimer's and dementia compared to older white women. It is the third leading cause of death for women. "More men are becoming caregivers for the women in their lives," said Grimes. "To give them the resources, we established the first and only all men's support group who need the skills and support system to handle the demands of caring for their loved ones."

Alzheimer's and dementia impacts entire families. To address the questions and concerns families will have and in honor of his mother, Grimes established the Gloria Grimes Alzheimer's and Dementia Community Resource Center at 8467 S. Van Ness Avenue in Inglewood, California. The Center is free and the hours of operation are from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. It is designed to provide in-depth resources, vital information, support, and hopefully, the inspiration to cope, as well as help the cause to end Alzheimer's and dementia. 
