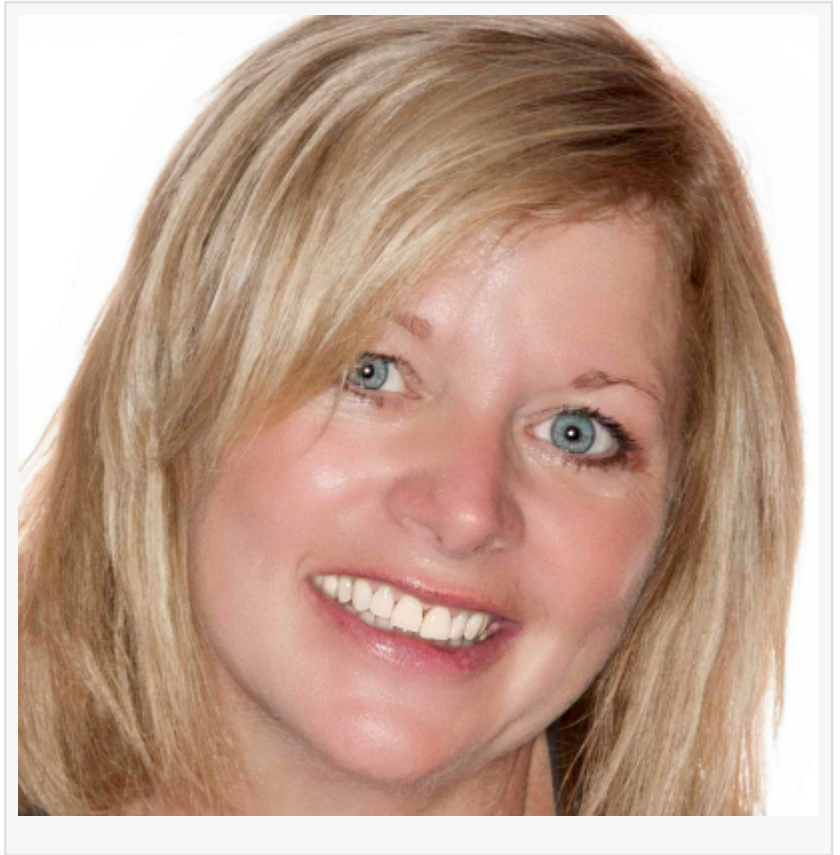
"Quantum means sudden and significant," says Farrell. "That's exactly the impact of my work. Immediate shifts can happen when we focus and work on what is most significant in our lives."
