High-risk work groups for exposure to asbestos in Massachusetts include US Navy Veterans, former workers at the Boston Navy Shipyard, workers at one of dozens of power plants in Massachusetts, shipyard workers, maritime workers, oil refinery workers, manufacturing workers, public utility workers, welders, millwrights, pipefitters, plumbers, electricians, auto mechanics, machinists, or construction workers. Typically, the exposure to asbestos occurred in the 1950's, 1960's, 1970's, or 1980's.
