

High-risk work groups for exposure to asbestos in Minnesota include Veterans of the US Navy, a worker at one of dozens of power plants in Minnesota, factory workers, welders, millwrights, pipefitters, industrial workers, public utility workers, plumbers, electricians, boiler technicians, auto mechanics, machinists, iron ore miners, and construction workers. Typically, the exposure to asbestos occurred in the 1950's, 1960's, 1970's, or 1980's. www.karstvonoste.com/
