

Alabama US Navy Veterans Lung Cancer Advocate High-risk work groups for exposure to asbestos in Alabama include US Navy Veterans, workers at Maxwell Air Force Base or Fort Rucker, workers at one of Alabama's 8 power plants, shipyard workers, oil refinery workers, steel mill workers, pulp and paper mill workers, manufacturing workers, industrial workers, public utility workers, plumbers, electricians, auto mechanics, machinists, or miners. 
