

# Oregon US Navy Veterans Lung Cancer Advocate Urges a Family of a Navy Veteran with Lung Cancer in Oregon Who Had Asbestos Exposure in the Navy to Call the Lawyers at Karst von Oiste About Possible \$100,000 Compensation

According to the American Cancer Society for nonsmokers who have been exposed to asbestos in their workplace the risk of lung cancer is five times that of unexposed workers. <https://www.cdc.gov/cancer/lung/statistics/index.htm>.
