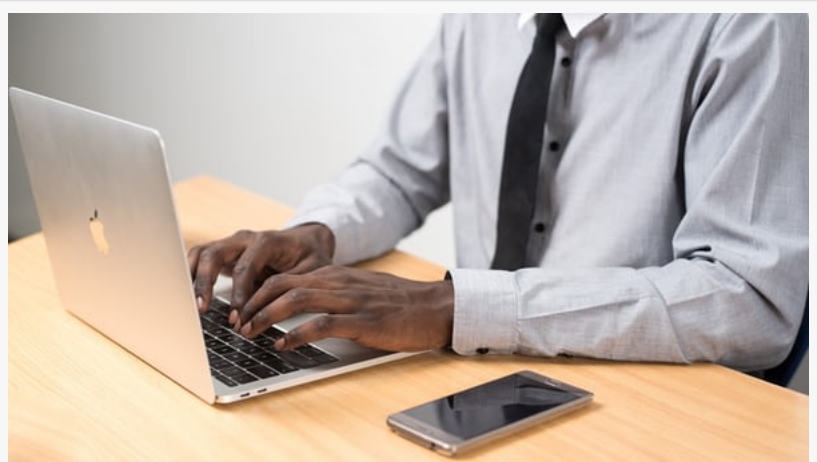
hours? Where do you want to live?
