

# Pennsylvania US Navy Veterans Lung Cancer Advocate Urges The Family of a Navy Veteran with Lung Cancer to Call the Lawyers at Karst von Oiste if He Had Asbestos Exposure in the Navy-Compensation May Exceed \$100,000

What most people and or Navy Veterans with lung cancer may not know is the \$30 billion dollar-asbestos trust funds were set up for them too. If you have a Navy Veteran friend in Pennsylvania with lung cancer-please ask him if he had heavy exposure to asbestos in the navy. High-risk work groups for exposure to asbestos in Pennsylvania include US Navy Veterans, power plant workers, shipyard workers at the Philadelphia Navy Yard, oil refinery workers, steel mill workers, coal miners, manufacturing workers, public utility workers, plumbers, electricians, auto mechanics, welders, millwrights, insulators, machinists, or construction workers. Typically, the person's exposure to asbestos occurred in the 1950's, 1960's, 1970's, or 1980's.

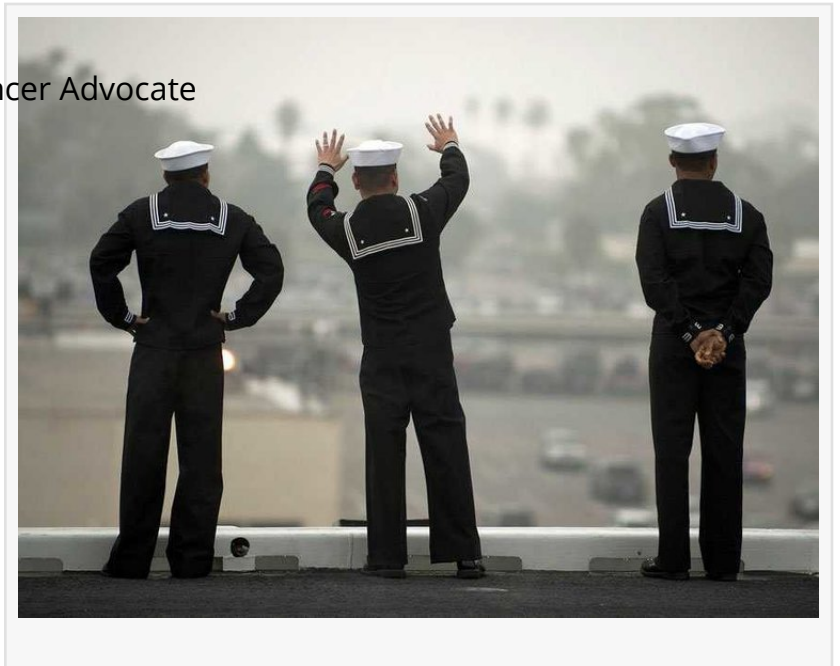
