Amy Cates Lance, 54, said: "Surrounded by many Seniors who were my real estate clients, along with Seniors in my family and networking circles, it was clear from multiple conversations that most Internet websites offer only silos of information for Seniors' interests and needs. Therefore the need for a comprehensive, unique website in a brief blog format with witty teasers" because as a friend of Lance shared.. "the older a person gets, sometimes the harder it is to find a sense of humor!" These words resonated with Lance's desire to offer more than just an aggregator of news and current trends. This fresh approach is working too, with the help of the AgingTopic team of bloggers who research the internet and offer their sense of humor.

Using this site as a way to present current information with a personal touch is a vital key to connecting with Seniors of all ages. The pandemic led to depressing isolation for many older Seniors (75 and older), and true anxiety for those younger Seniors (60 and older) whose parents

are struggling with the risk and dramatic lock-down as a result. The trends and news covered in this site are critical for both the aging parents and their adult children who are now entering this stage. Understanding the differences among options from Aging in Place to Continuing Care Retirement Communities and other choices is increasingly important, and to a large degree an unmet need.
