

Maxwell Air Force Base or Fort Rucker, workers at one of Alabama's 8 power plants, shipyard workers, oil refinery workers, steel mill workers, pulp and paper mill workers, manufacturing workers, industrial workers, public utility workers, plumbers, electricians, auto mechanics, machinists, or miners. Typically, the exposure to asbestos occurred in the 1950's, 1960's, 1970's, or 1980's.


