Veteran had heavy to extreme exposure to asbestos. A compensation claim like this might be worth more than \$100,000 and it does not involve a lawsuit against the navy. It also does not matter if the person smoked cigarettes.

"We are advocates for Navy Veterans and people who have recently developed lung cancer and who prior to 1982 also had significant exposure to asbestos and we want people like this to receive the best possible financial compensation. To receive the best possible compensationit is incredibly important a person like this recall the specifics of how, where and when they were exposed to

High-risk work groups for exposure to asbestos in Pennsylvania include US Navy Veterans, power plant workers, shipyard workers at the Philadelphia Navy Yard, oil refinery workers, steel mill workers, coal miners, manufacturing workers, public utility workers, plumbers, electricians, auto mechanics, welders,



millwrights, insulators, machinists, or construction workers. Typically, the person's exposure to asbestos occurred in the 1950's, 1960's, 1970's, or 1980's. <u>www.karstvonoiste.com/</u>

According to the American Cancer Society for nonsmokers who have been exposed to asbestos in their workplace the risk of lung cancer is five times that of unexposed workers. <u>https://www.cdc.gov/cancer/lung/statistics/index.htm</u>.
