

## The Advocate Urges a Family of a Navy Veteran Who Now Has Lung Cancer in Ohio and Had Navy Asbestos Exposure to Call Attorney Erik Karst of Karst von Oiste About Compensation-It Might Be \$100,000+

High-risk work groups for exposure to asbestos in Ohio include Veterans of the US Navy, civilian workers at Wright Patterson Air Force Base, workers at one of Ohio's dozen-plus power plants, auto assembly plant workers, automobile ties factory workers, public utility workers, plumbers, welders, millwrights, insulators, pipefitters, electricians, coal miners, auto mechanics, machinists, and construction workers.
