•Inild (under age 23 on September 30, 2022) of an active duty, retired, or deceased Sailor or Marine

•Bpouse of an active duty or retired Sailor or Marine •MECEP/ MECP Student

Consideration for selection is based on GPA and financial need. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors, full-time (minimum 12 credit hours) college students or Sailor/ Marine spouses seeking their first undergraduate degree or master's degree.

If submitting by mail, applications must be postmarked no later than June 3, 2022.
