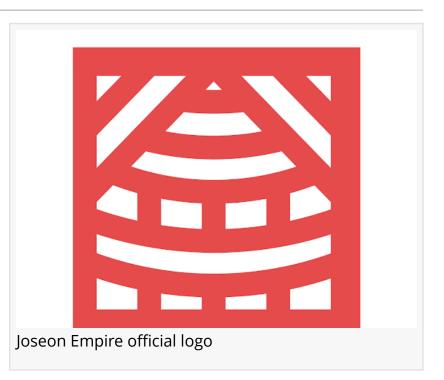


Joseon Empire and the Government of Antigua and Barbuda Sign Treaty of Peace, Amity and Commerce
