

## Austrian Post launched Blockchain Crypto stamp with Augmented Reality - Bull as new motif

FIRST CRYPTO STAMP JOINT ISSUE WITH THE NETHERLANDS

VIENNA, AUSTRIA, September 27, 2022 /EINPresswire.com/ -- Austrian Post and PostNL are launching the world's first joint issue of a <u>Crypto stamp</u>. The Austrian Post has issued the world's first blockchain stamp with a digital twin on the Ethereum Blockchain in 2019.

Both editions of the new 2022 Crypto stamp – in Austria "Crypto stamp 4.0", in the Netherlands the "NL Crypto stamp" – share the same motif of the Bull. The bull is synonymous with optimism in the crypto and financial worlds and bull markets also mean rising prices.
