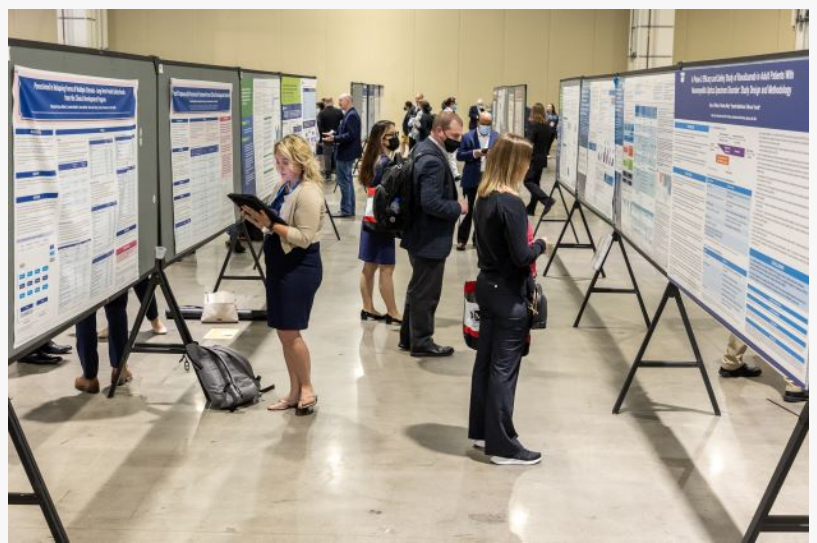


# Abstracts for CMSC 2023 Annual Meeting Reflect Latest Multidisciplinary Multiple Sclerosis Research

New this year is a platform session on the topic of neuroimaging in MS, noted Ms. Perrin Ross, Neuroscience Program Coordinator at Loyola University Medical Center in Maywood, IL. “We are also seeing a trend toward reporting on Phase IV trial results,” she added. “These are postmarketing studies of already approved disease-modifying therapies that can help to better inform us about efficacy outcomes, safety data, and pregnancy outcomes.”
