


## End Brain Cancer Initiative (EBCI) Announces Winner of National HOPE Award

This may have changed my life, but looking back I am so glad it gave me a tremendous amount of strength, brought me closer to my family, and made me look at life differently. This was my second chance at life."

She also predicts "One day we will find a cure. I'm only 21 and I will never stop having HOPE."
