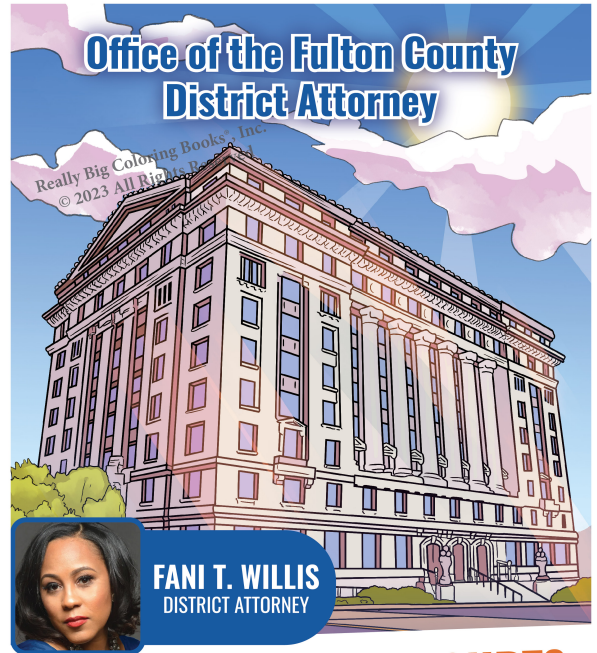

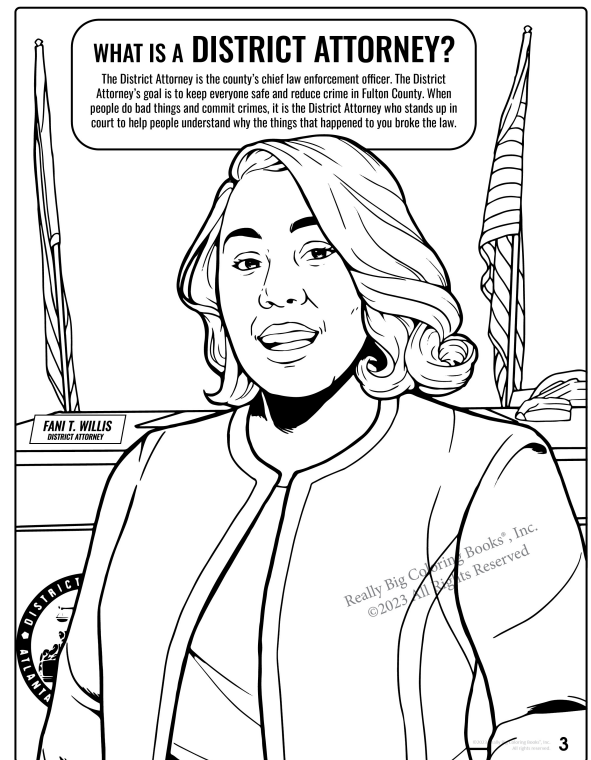

RULES WHILE TESTIFYING:

1. Always tell the truth.
2. Do not nod or shake your head or mumble "uh huh" or "uh uh."
3. Answer in a loud, clear voice.
4. If you don't understand a question, ask to have it repeated. Do not give an answer to a question you do not understand.
5. If you do not remember or do not know something, just say, "I don't remember."
6. Do not say you do not remember something just because it is painful or embarrassing to discuss.
7. As much as possible, try to remember and repeat the words the defendant used when you are asked what he or she said.
8. If you find yourself getting upset or tearful, or if you need a break for any reason, feel free to ask the judge.

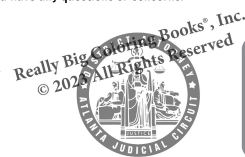
