


Well Known Mississippi Judge Pens Buzzworthy Book With an Important Anti-Bullying Message

would give children both a character to root for and identify with."

Wannabee Hero: BeeBop, a young orphan bee, wants to make a name for himself in the hive that adopted him. But prejudice and an oversized bully bee stand in his way. The hive desperately needs a major nectar find before winter and BeeBop makes the biggest discovery in the history of the hive.
