After leaving the battlefield, IDF soldiers face numerous challenges as they grapple with the unimaginable experiences they've endured. Their ability to function, take care of themselves,

and interact with others is severely impacted. While the government in Israel provides some assistance, wounded members of the Israel Defense Forces receive only the bare minimum to survive. Many suffer from PTSD or debilitating injuries that render them immobile and unable to work. Necessities such as food and toiletries become inaccessible to these brave men and women, leaving them unable to provide for themselves and their families. "They are wounded, scared, and alone and struggle to transition back into society. They need our help now, more than ever," exclaimed Rabbi Vigler, founder of Belev Echad.

With hospitals currently overwhelmed with patients, Belev Echad converted their facility in Israel to a rehabilitation facility to help the wounded. Their team has been visiting multiple hospitals every day, reaching out to thousands of wounded soldiers, and creating emergency care packages to help them with their basic essential needs.

Currently, there are 50,000 wounded soldiers in need of food, medical care, and psychological assistance. Belev Echad provides the necessary support to meet these necessities and urgently needs help to save the lives of wounded IDF soldiers.

What initially started as a local initiative out of NY in 2009 by Rabbi Uriel and Shevy Vigler, Belev Echad has evolved into an international non-profit organization with a singular mission: supporting wounded IDF soldiers and veterans.

Belev Echad provides essential aid and support, addressing their physical, psychological, and professional healing. This encompasses providing freshly prepared meals twice a day, ensuring nourishment to immobilized soldiers by delivering food and essentials directly to them at home, as well as creating a nurturing space for healing and recovery where soldiers with physical and mental traumas can connect with others who have shared similar experiences. Rehabilitation programs and other vital initiatives further facilitate their recovery. Ultimately, Belev Echad equips wounded IDF soldiers with everything they need to heal, rehabilitate, and successfully reintegrate into civilian life, ensuring a seamless transition and enabling them to resume their lives with renewed hope.
