This slow encroachment due to an evergrowing thirst for more content continues to threaten women's rights, aiding and abetting systemic racism, and perpetuating ageism, all while stifling creativity and diversity. The world has been subjected to this constant warfare, staged and re-enacted for decades."

She further emphasized the gravity of the situation, drawing parallels between the enduring plight of the Sahrawi refugees, who have been displaced for over 40 years, and the recent crisis in Ukraine. According to the United Nations Human Rights Council 2022 report, an astounding 108.4 million people were forcibly displaced worldwide.

Cynthia's connection to the Western Sahara dates back to 2001 when she visited the region to raise awareness for Saharawi refugees who were striving for peaceful self-determination. Her tireless efforts were recognized in 2005 when she was nominated for a shared Nobel Peace Prize as part of the "1000 Peace Women Across the Globe."



rights, such as the current strike of union workers in the sagaftra/Wga entertainment and other industries. She is also the author of the book "How To Be Civil In An Uncivil World" and the host of the podcast "The World According to Cynthia."

Currently residing and recording in Nashville, Cynthia is widely regarded as "one of the truly great voices of our time," often drawing comparisons to legendary country and jazz artists such as Johnny Cash, Patsy Cline, Diane Washington, and Sarah Vaughn. Which can be heard on her latest releases "you belong to me", "if every day could be like Christmas" (Elvis's classic), and original biggest fool of all" recorded at famed Hilltop Recording Studio's. Her influence extends to contemporary artists and pop culture, worldwide.
