Forbes in September 2023 wrote "How common is mental illness in the world 2023? Worldwide: Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the number of anxiety and depressive disorders grew. Depressive symptoms grew from a base of about 193 million people worldwide to 246 million, which is about 28%. Anxiety disorders grew from about 298 million people affected to 374 million, which is about a 25% increase" People need charities like ours to be able to offer the help that's needed as all other forms of support like crisis lines and the UK`s NHS are too overwhelmed.

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
