


SideBar Welcomes John Echohawk, Attorney and Executive Director of the Native American Rights Fund

Since 1970, the Native American Rights Fund (NARF) has provided legal assistance to Native American tribes, organizations, and individuals who otherwise might have gone without adequate representation. NARF has successfully asserted and defended the most important rights of Indians and tribes in hundreds of major cases and has achieved significant results in such critical areas as tribal sovereignty, treaty rights, natural resource protection, voting rights, and Indian education. Cohost Mitch Winick pointed out that, "Most of us, including most lawyers, have no real appreciation of how the rights of Native Americans and their tribes are addressed through treaties, federal laws, and an entire body of tribal law and tribal courts. John and NARF have been on the front line of developing the complex body of Indian Law and defending Native American rights under those laws."

NARF has impacted tens of thousands of Native Americans in its work for more than 300 tribes. Some examples of the results include:

• Protecting and establishing the inherent sovereignty of tribes;

• Obtaining official tribal recognition for numerous Indian tribes;
