

no place to live. "We are going to build a modern dog shelter with \$7 million, but don't bother asking the county or the city for one penny to help our homeless citizens."

So, the real question is, "How do you build a homeless shelter that works and is acceptable to the entire community with donations only?" This book tells the story of one Sierra community's effort to answer this question and how its success proved that it could be done; however, its success also turned the city's power establishment

against it.

When it was obvious that the shelter was a success and homeless people were thriving, the city's power structure got together and closed it down, throwing forty homeless men and women out of their shelter in the middle of winter with no place to live.

But the genie is out of the bottle now, and the occupants of this small gold mining town know how to do it the next time. They are prepared to try again until they are successful, even though




