


CCE Wins Educator Pathway Grant

Federal award will support a grow-yourown teacher model

The USDOE website states that the TQP program is designed to improve student outcomes. In addition, the program seeks to "recruit highly qualified individuals, including minorities and individuals from other occupations, into the teaching force."

"As we respond to the critical and persistent teacher shortage in southern CA, CCE will continue to create programs and partner with organizations that are intentional in developing community-based teaching workforces that reflect a school's student population," said Yvonne Ribas, CCE Director for Community and Schools CCE's educator pathway programs have partnered in the past with multiple California Community Colleges.
