Tai Ji Men is an ancient menpai (similar to school) of qigong, martial arts, and self cultivation. The culture of Tai Ji Men is rooted in the Tao tradition, passed down from generation to generation, serving as a wellspring of guidance and wisdom. Its mission is to carry forward the Tai Ji Men culture and promote the physical, mental, and spiritual well-being of people worldwide. It operates as an international nonprofit cultural organization.

Tai Ji Men was invited to perform at prestigious venues worldwide, including the Sydney Opera House in Australia, the 2000 Summer Olympics, the United States Capitol Hill building, the Seattle Seafair Torchlight Parade, Disneyland, the National Theater and Concert Hall in Taipei, and the 2017 Universiade. In October 2023, the Tai Ji Men Qigong Academy marked the grand opening of its Santa Clara and Pasadena academies with a series of captivating performances that seamlessly blended tradition with modernity, highlighting the importance of peaceful coexistence between humans and nature.
