

Treendale Pet Medical Attends Seminar on Advanced Snake Envenomation and Toxicities

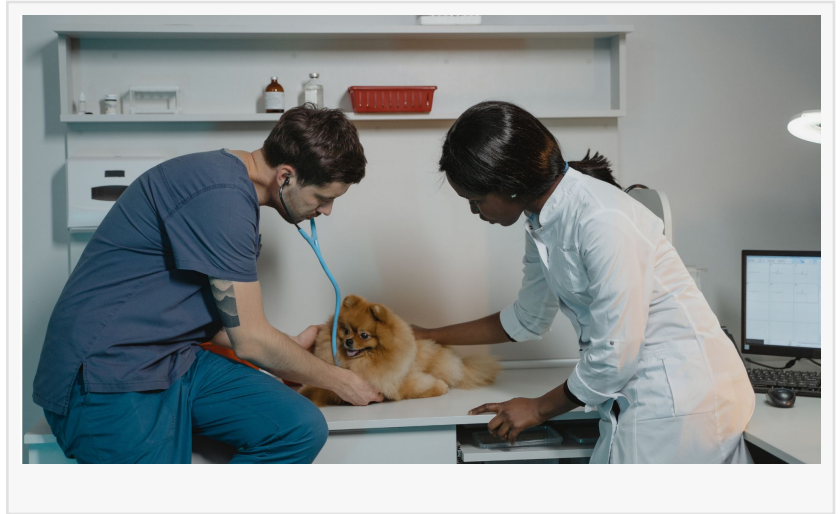

In addition to snake envenomation, the VNCA WA Division Seminar also addressed other commonly seen toxicities in companion animals. Participants learned about the general approach to decontamination and supportive care, as well as specific treatment strategies for individual toxins. The seminar also highlighted the importance of identifying look-alike substances that may mimic snake envenomations or toxicities.
