The seven concerts will feature performances by top country music artists and all proceeds will go towards supporting American veterans who have served our country and carry mental or physical scars. This is the 10th anniversary of Keepin' It Country Farm's concert series.

The first concert will take place on May 18th at 7pm ET and will feature T. Graham Brown. Brown, known for hits such as "Hell and High Water" and "Don't Go to Strangers," has been a prominent figure in country music for over five decades.

On June 22nd at 7pm ET, Ronnie McDowell will take the stage. McDowell, famous for his tribute song "The King Is Gone," has had over 30 top 40 hits and multiple #1 songs.

Georgette Jones, daughter of country music legends Tammy Wynette and George Jones, will perform on July 20th at 7pm ET. Jones has followed in her parents' footsteps and has also had success as a country music artist.

On August 10th at 7pm ET, John Berry will entertain the audience with his smooth voice and hits like "Your Love Amazes Me" and "Standing on the Edge of Goodbye."

The concert series will continue on September 28th at 7pm ET with a performance by Jimmy Fortune, best known as a member of the iconic country group The Statler Brothers.

On October 19th at 7pm ET, Sirius/XM radio host and country music artist Dallas Wayne will take the stage, followed by Richard Lynch himself and special guests on November 2nd at 7pm ET.

T. GRAHAM BROWN – MAY 18, 7 PM

Brown's initial entry to Country Radio was "Drowning in Memories," a top-40 single that helped establish himself, and in 1986, he released "I Tell It Like It Used To Be." His first self-penned release "Hell And High Water" became his first #1 song. "I Wish That Could Hurt That Way Again" and "Don't Go To Strangers" were the next releases, which all became chart-toppers. He continued to amass more hits like "Darlene," the smash duet "Don't Go Out" with Tanya Tucker, and the regret-filled "If You Could Only See Me Now." In recent years, his first-ever Gospel album, *Forever Changed*, netted him a Grammy nomination. And for T. Graham Brown, it's all about a career that he enjoys.



RONNIE MCDOWELL – JUNE 22, 7 PM

Following the death of Elvis Presley in 1977, Ronnie McDowell recorded his heartfelt and self-penned tribute song "The King Is Gone" on the independent Scorpion label. To date, "The King Is Gone" has sold more than 1 million copies. He charted a string of 11 singles and albums for Epic between 1979 and 1988. Every single released with the exception of just one became a Top 10 hit including the chart toppers "Older Women" and "You're Gonna Run My Dad Reputation." Other hits during his Epic years included "Walkin' Gals Go By," "Personally," "You Made A Wanted Man Of Me," "All Tied Up," and "In A New York Minute." Ronnie continues to entertain audiences with his own blend of romantic intimacy and country excitement!



GEORGETTE JONES – JULY 20, 7 PM

Georgette Jones was born to country music legends and Hall of Fame couple, George Jones and Tammy Wynette. She's been singing on stage since she was three years old. At the age of 16, she recorded her first duet with her father, "Daddy Come Home." Georgette has performed at the Opry, the Ryman and has toured across the U.S., Canada and overseas. In addition to singing and songwriting, she is also an author, co-wrote her biography "The Three of Us," which was about her life growing up with her famous parents. Most recently, she is concentrating on her love of gaming and on bringing Country Music into the world of gaming. She is now streaming and enjoys connecting with fans and other gamers online.



JOHN BERRY – AUGUST 10, 7 PM

Single-songwriter John Berry rose to stardom on the country charts of the 1950s with such mega hits as "Your Love Amazes Me," Standing on the Edge of Goodbye and "She's Taken a Shine." His annual Christmas tours include his electrifying rendition of "I Hope You're Right." During his star-making decade, John placed 20 singles on the country charts, 6 of which went Top 5. He has earned multiple Gold and Platinum Records. His songs "This Year's Gonna Be the Year" inducted into the Carolina Country Music Association's Hall of Fame and the North American Country Music Association. He will continue his healthy touring schedule throughout the year and wrap it up with his 28th annual Christmas Tour.



JIMMY FORTUNE – SEPTEMBER 28, 7 PM

Jimmy's recognizable tenor has graced some of the biggest hits of Country music, earning the Virginia native a spot in both the hallowed ranks of the Country Music Hall of Fame as well as the Gospel Music Hall of Fame. In the early 1980s, Jimmy joined the Statler Brothers. Fortune wrote and sang lead on many of their biggest hits, "Elizabeth," "Too Much On My Heart," "Forever" and "More Than A Name On A Wall" are just a few of the Statlers' hits that feature the Fortune name and voice. In 2020, Jimmy joined his friends Ben Isaacs, Mike Rogers and Bradley Walker in recording a quartet-style project called *Brotherly Love* that debuted #16 Billboard (all genres) Top Album Sales on 9-19-20. Jimmy is currently living in Tennessee, writing, touring and recording music.



DALLAS WAYNE – OCTOBER 19, 7 PM

At an age when many folks are thinking about retirement, Dallas Wayne is hitting his stride. Throughout his decades-long career, Dallas has performed across North America and Europe, after honing his vocal style in Nashville where he first began songwriting. He has graced some of the most hallowed stages in the country music scene from the Grand Ole Opry, Country's Family Reunion and Larry's Country Diner to the Ernest Tubb Michite Jamboree and Willie Nelson's Fourth of July Picnic. He has released 13 albums of his own, as well as performing on various compilation and band recordings including with Healyak, The TwangBangers and a Grammy-nominated Special Consensus bluegrass album.



RICHARD LYNCH AND FRIENDS – NOVEMBER 2, 7 PM

Richard Lynch is a Nashville recording artist, Independent Country Music Hall of Fame inductee and Ohio Country Music Hall of Fame inductee. Richard has compiled a long list of country hits and chart-toppers on both domestic and international sales and radio airplay charts, including two #1 iTunes chart singles, multiple #1 New Music Weekly radio songs, #1 IndieWorld and Roots Music Report chart tracks and a Christian Music Weekly Top 20 single. Richard has been in *Billboard Magazine*, *Take-Of-Country*, *The Boot*, *CCM Magazine*, *Country Music People*, and countless others. He has also appeared on WSM Radio Nashville, *RFDTV*, Fox TV and more. In 2023, Richard Lynch released his 6th album, "Radio Friend" featuring 12 songs written or co-written by Richard.
