The grain elevator, built in 1951, was severely damaged in 2022 during a hailstorm that devastated the town. It also houses the Timber Bronze business, where owner Garrett Lowe handcrafts unique architectural elements inspired by nature. Some of his products include country farmhouse bronze doorbells, classic drawer pulls, morel mushroom

bottle stoppers, and larger bronze artworks. Funds raised will go toward preserving the remaining structure to be used as a community hub and experience center for the town and those traveling through Wallowa.

“My wife Beth and I, along with many other members of our community, have a vision for the future of Wallowa, and the grain elevator complex is a big part of that,” said Garrett Lowe, owner of Timber Bronze. “We are uniquely positioned as a natural stopping point for visitors on the way to Joseph, Oregon, and [Wallowa Lake](#), an area of Oregon that is growing in popularity with tourists. We see the grain elevator complex and our downtown area as a perfect destination for travelers to shop, dine, and learn about our rich history.”

Beth and Garrett are part of that rich history, with Beth's family marking the seventh generation to call Wallowa home.
