families in a familiar environment.







## In-home Pet Euthanasia Costs

The cost of in-home euthanasia starts at \$300 in Denver, CO. Aftercare begins at \$100 for communal cremation but the final price depends on factors such as the driving distance, the pet's size, and the option for private or communal cremation. The company also offers out-of-hours appointments for an additional fee.
