

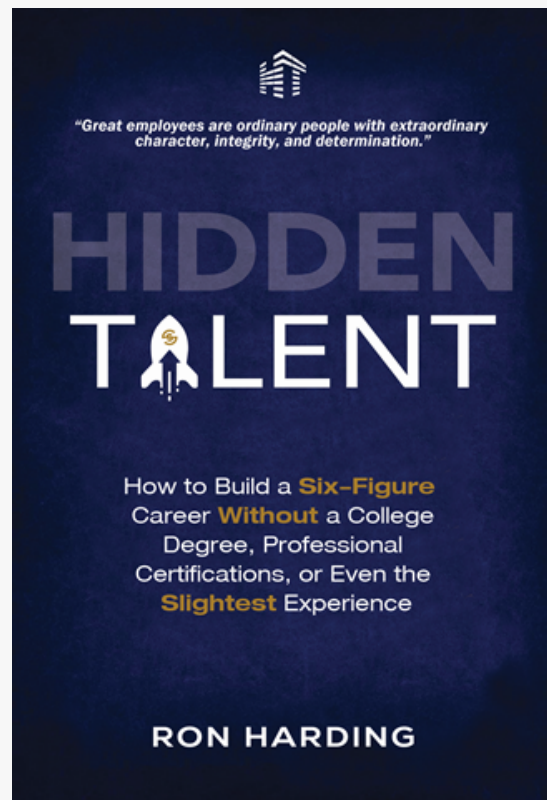

Ron Harding: High school dropout grows up to be hero, business award winner

Ron Harding has been a high school dropout, a soldier and a hero.

Today, he is being honored as the outstanding Southern California small-business person of the year by the U.S. Small Business Administration.

"I started this business coming from a truck driver," says the owner of Anaheim-based Ron Harding Moving Services Inc. "It's a tough business. There's not a school you can go to to learn it.

"But this makes it all worthwhile," he adds, gesturing toward resolutions from the city of Anaheim and the California State Assembly commending him for the SBA award.

The award presentation caps off

National Small Business Week, which ends today.

"Out of the numerous award applications submitted," says John Turnpik, spokesman for the SBA Los Angeles District office, "Ron Harding stood out because of his accomplishments in overcoming a handicap and his community involvement, combined with his outstanding record of performance during the 1984 Olympics."

This is hardly the first recognition Harding has received. The paneled walls of his comfortable office are covered with plaques commemorating achievements: the 1984 Black Business Alliance of Orange County business person of the year award; a commendation from Xerox for his efforts as a contractor; a framed letter from Peter Ueberroth thanking him for providing moving services during

the Olympics.

"Peter Ueberroth has become a good client," Harding jokes. After Harding's company did 65 percent of the moving for the Olympics, it moved Ueberroth's two daughters to college. "We also moved him personally to New York when he became baseball commissioner," Harding adds.

Harding's plans were not Olympic when he and his wife, Judy, started the trucking business from their garage in 1979.

A year earlier, Harding lost both legs when he swerved the moving van he was driving to avoid hitting a car driven by a young mother who had two children with her. The accident left him a hero, but with no way to support his family.
