blooms.

pH Levels: Ensure the pH is balanced between 7.2 and 7.6.

Alkalinity and Calcium Hardness: Adjust alkalinity to 80–120 ppm and calcium hardness to 200–400 ppm to protect pool surfaces and equipment.

Sanitizer Levels: Maintain chlorine or other sanitizers at the

recommended levels to keep the water clean and clear.

3. Lower the Water Level

Depending on the pool’s design, it may be necessary to lower the water level below the skimmer to prevent damage during freezing temperatures.

Avoid Draining Completely: Never drain the pool entirely, as this can cause structural damage.

Account for Rainwater: Ensure the lowered level leaves room for rainwater without risking overflow.

4. Winterize Pool Equipment

Properly preparing pool equipment prevents freezing damage and extends its lifespan.
