Recognizing foundation damage early is essential in preventing further structural issues. Common signs of foundation problems include:

Cracks in interior or exterior walls Uneven or sloping floors Doors and windows sticking or failing to close properly Gaps around door frames or baseboards Water pooling near the foundation
