

Physician Reveals Concerning Trend in Health Care Pricing and What Can Be Done About It

What's causing it? Experts say it's due to the rise in hospitals acquiring smaller medical practices, allowing them to charge more for the same service than the practice would normally bill. According to <u>statistics</u>, when a physician's office is acquired by a hospital system, prices increase by more than 14%.

A recent study found half of US adults reported difficulty affording health care, and 1 in 4 said they skipped needed care because of it.
