


## BBFL × WaRLock Collaboration Launches: Japanese-American Hybrid Fashion to the World

The event was curated by Spree Kingyo and Maria Stewart, both of whom offered deep insights into the fusion of traditions and modernity throughout the collection.

The Contemporary Japanese Folk Collective (CJFC) also joined the festival to showcase their creative interpretations, adding a unique dimension to the event and highlighting the fusion of traditional and contemporary fashion elements.
