United Church of Christ (UCC) – for its bold and public faith-rooted allyship, including the courageous decision to serve as “body shields” during the NTVM Rally

Gender Liberation – for preserving the legacy of trans-led liberation and uplifting the stories of Black and Brown TGNBI people
