places and should be removed from around the house's foundation. Leaving a clear perimeter not only limits pest shelter options but also improves the pest technician's access to potential entry points.

Inside the home, preparation is equally important. Thacker explains that the most effective treatments happen when technicians can inspect and treat areas where pests are active. This includes kitchens, bathrooms, utility areas, and basements. Moving furniture or storage bins away from walls allows technicians to apply treatments properly and spot signs of activity, such as droppings or nests.

While cleanliness is helpful, Thacker notes that homeowners should avoid over-cleaning before the visit. Wiping down counters and vacuuming is good practice, but erasing evidence of pest activity may unintentionally hide problem areas. Allowing the technician to observe the visible signs of an infestation can lead to a more targeted and successful treatment.

Another key point in pest control home preparation involves pet safety. Thacker recommends securing or removing pets, including aquariums and pet bedding, from the treatment areas before technicians arrive. Some treatments may require animals to be kept away for a period afterward, so it's best to ask for specific instructions.

Communication also plays a vital role. If a homeowner has heard scratching in the walls, seen ants in the kitchen, or noticed droppings in a particular area, sharing these details with the technician can speed up problem detection. Knowing where to look saves time and allows the technician to apply treatments more precisely.

After a treatment, homeowners should try to avoid disrupting the treated areas. Cleaning floors or baseboards too soon can reduce the treatment's effectiveness. According to Thacker, maintaining clear access and avoiding excessive cleaning in the days following a visit can help pesticides work as intended.
