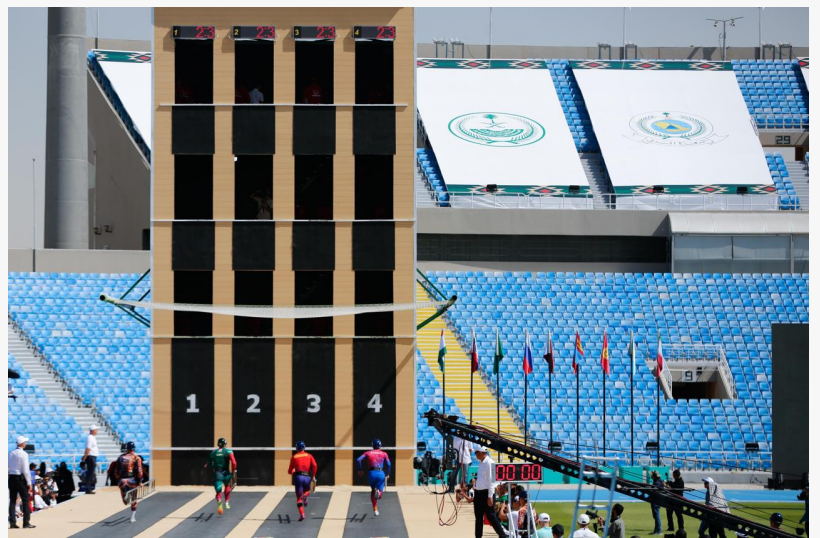
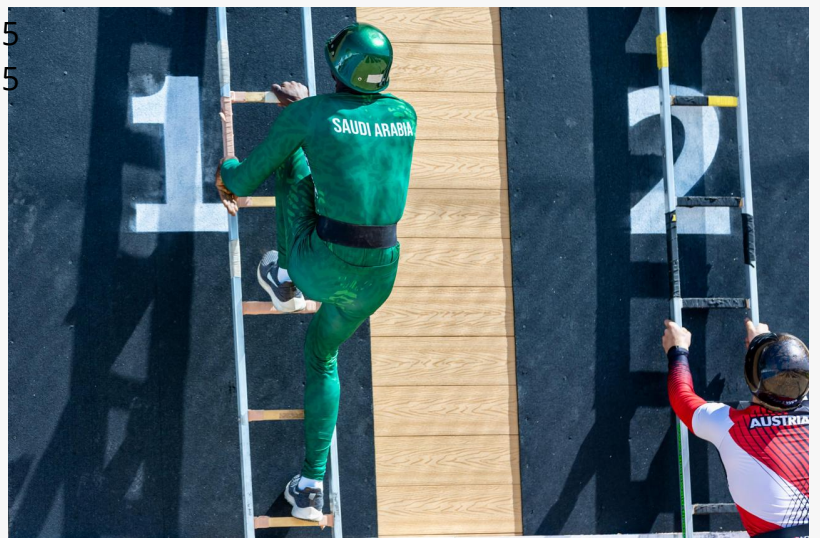
The World Fire and Rescue Championship 2025 Opens in Riyadh
