

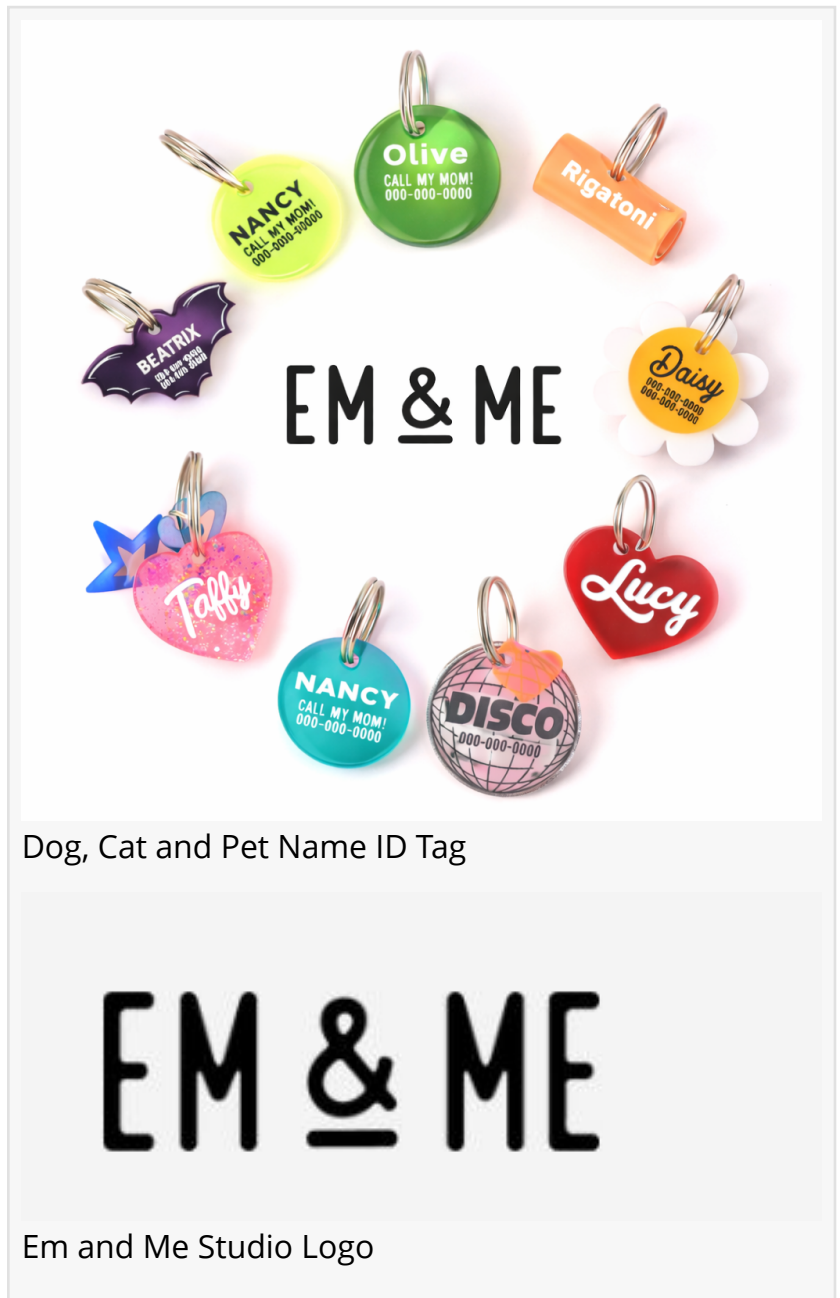
# 2026 Pet ID Trends Report: Why Micro-Tags, Personalization, and Statement Names Are Reshaping the Pet Accessories

The report analyzed 146 personalized pet tag orders placed through Em & Me Studio in early 2026. While the sample reflects internal order data rather than industry-wide totals, the patterns offer insight into emerging preferences among modern pet owners.

Names ranking 11–25 include Rickey, Daisy, and Biscuit (3 each), followed by Willow, Luma, Trudie, Girlie, Ham, Duke, Reggie, Ruby, Mixtli, Scarlett, Tessie, and Charlie (2 each).

### Key naming insights

Luna continues to lead. With 11 occurrences, Luna nearly doubled the next most popular name, reinforcing its sustained multi-year popularity among female dogs. Its continued strength reflects a preference for soft, celestial tones that align with broader national naming patterns.

Food-inspired names show measurable momentum. Rigatoni, Figgy, Biscuit, Maple, Ham, Cannoli, Orzo, Pizza, Eggs, and Toast illustrate growing demand for playful, culinary-inspired names. These choices reflect humor, personality, and the ongoing humanization of pets.

Classic human names remain stable. Lucy, Charlie, Ruby, Daisy, Louie, and Martina demonstrate that human-first naming remains a consistent category. This trend parallels broader lifestyle branding patterns and reinforces the perception of pets as family members.

Nature-based names maintain influence. Olive, Maple, Willow, Fern, and Poppy signal sustained interest in botanical and earth-inspired names, particularly among aesthetic-focused consumers.

Product-level trend: The rise of [tiny micro-tags](#)

One of the most significant findings in the 2026 report is the accelerating demand for micro-

sized pet ID tags. These smaller, lighter tags are particularly popular among owners of toy and small breeds, puppies, minimalist collar styles, and customers who layer decorative charms alongside identification tags.

Consumers are increasingly attentive to weight, proportion, and design balance. Micro-tags provide functionality without visual bulk, aligning with modern collar aesthetics and comfort priorities. Notably, smaller size has not reduced personalization complexity. Instead, engraving sophistication has increased, with growing requests for clean typographic layouts, dual-font pairings, centered minimalist formats, and intentional line emphasis.

### Personalization expands beyond standard engraving

While tag sizes trend smaller, personalization itself is becoming more expressive. The report identifies increased demand for expanded engraving lines, custom phrases beyond name and phone number, hand-drawn styles, symbolic characters where formatting allows, and distinctive shape-based silhouettes such as florals, geometric cuts, and modern discs.

Rather than selecting a default layout, customers are actively shaping visual identity. The pet ID tag is increasingly treated as an extension of both the pet's personality and the owner's aesthetic preferences.

### From compliance item to lifestyle accessory

Historically, pet ID tags were primarily purchased for safety and identification. In 2026, that functional purpose remains essential, but purchasing motivation has expanded. Owners are coordinating tags with collar color palettes, harness styles, seasonal themes, and gifting occasions.

According to Em & Me Studio, repeat purchases are common among customers who rotate tags seasonally or for special events. Personalized pet tags are frequently purchased for new puppy announcements, birthdays, and holidays, reinforcing their role within the broader gifting ecosystem.

### Broader industry implications

The 2026 Pet ID Trends Report reflects several macro-level industry patterns. Humanization of pets continues to intensify. Customization is no longer a premium add-on but an expected baseline feature in ecommerce. Micro-design and proportion matter even in small-format products. Playfulness and originality drive engagement, particularly among younger pet owners.

As personalization technologies evolve and consumers continue to seek identity expression through purchases, small-format accessories such as pet ID tags are expected to become

increasingly design-centric.
