will include robotics engagement through FIRST Canada, mental wellness awareness led by CMHA Dufferin-Peel, cyber safety education from Rogers Cybersecure Catalyst at Toronto Metropolitan University, and financial literacy learning sessions delivered by TD Bank Group.

Adding to the excitement, students will be welcomed earlier in the morning by ACE, the mascot of the Toronto Blue Jays, whose visit highlights the shared spirit between cricket and baseball

and celebrates the importance of multi-sport opportunities for young people.
