

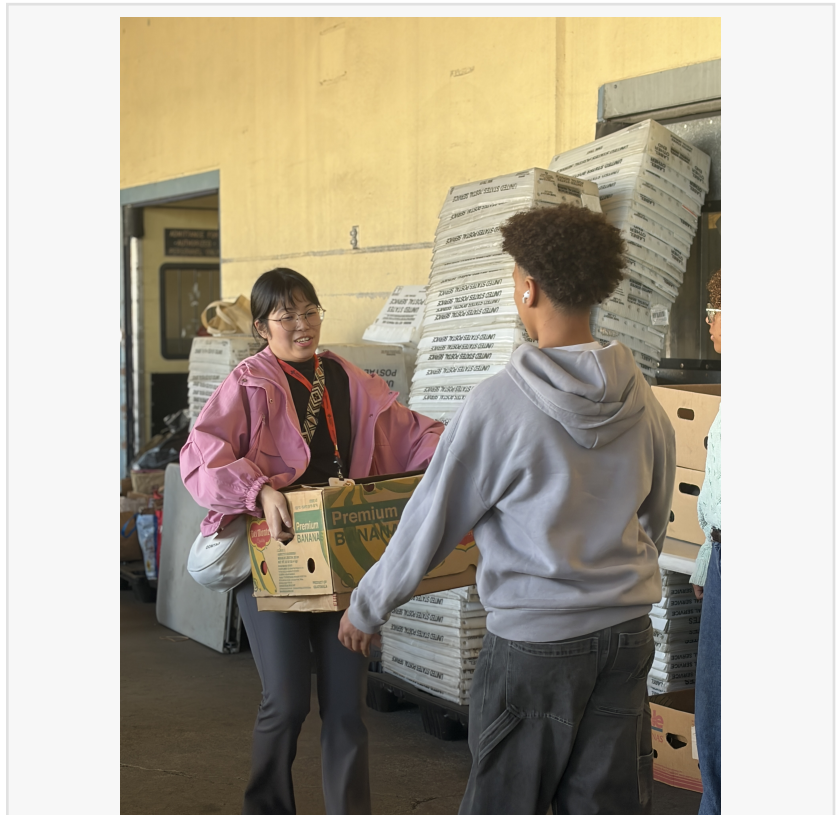
Davis Street Community Center Joins Annual USPS Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive
